- i) **Questions?**
 - 1. **Why are we contributing \$45/player for Dunbow Arena? There will be about \$35,000 to 40,000 extra expenses for such things as a score clock, nets, etc. It is in our best interest to have this arena up and running in time for league play next fall. In return, OMHA will be given 60% of prime time ice. We will not likely be reimbursed for this.**
 - 2. **What is the rationale for 10% cushion in reserves? We need a surplus for “extras” such as jersey replacement, net replacement, etc. Also, we don’t want to have to raise fees excessively in any given year.**
 - 3. **Where does Casino revenue go to? This will go towards our cash reserve.**
 - 4. **How much does the Coach Mentorship Program cost? \$16,000**
 - 5. **Did we get feedback to say the Mentorship program was successful? Bantam/Midget coaches were positive, and used the Mentors a lot. Novice/Atom did not give as good feedback. The Mentors were to be in contact with each team 1x/month. Some had more contact and some had less. The comment was made that the Mentors need to be more accountable. Jeff has been in contact with Skillz to discuss feedback. This was our pilot year for the program; we will be looking at improving the process for next year.**

- 4) **Open Forum**
- a) **How will we enforce Respect in Sport? This is mandated by Hockey Alberta. If anyone sees a person not behaving in an appropriate manner, they need to contact the Board. The Board can only deal with situations that they are made aware of.**
 - b) **Will we have new socks for the younger players? Yes, we already have them.**
 - c) **Will there be a summary from the Summit which was held in April? Yes, this is posted on our website.**
 - d) **Will there be any changes to the referees next year, as there were a number of young referees this year. No, we will continue to have young referees at the younger age groups.**
 - e) **Any thoughts about putting goalies through other sessions rather than the Skillz program? Goalie sessions on Sunday evenings provide extra practice for goalies. OMHA subsidizes this program by paying for the ice costs.**
 - f) **Can we save \$5500 from our Tune Ups program by using coaches to run it? The new board can make this decision, but it has been positive to use an outside organization as then there are no issues of coaches beginning their evaluations during Tune Ups.**
 - g) **Will the Dunbow arena alleviate the necessity of the cap on registration? Yes, for the time being. If you have players already in OMHA, don't siblings have the right to membership? No.**
 - h) **Is OMHA looking at better ways to evaluate players? Every year the evaluation process is reviewed and we have taken feedback from the membership and made some changes accordingly. Feedback can be given on the website.**
 - i) **An issue brought forward at the Hockey Summit was that evaluations should have a skills component. Will this happen? The Evaluation Committee will be looking at this issue. As well, evaluations of House League will be looked at.**
 - j) **With the cap in place, how do we determine who gets in? What happens to Initiation players who were not able to play last year due to the cap? The Board needs to look at this issue.**
 - k) **Will we continue to keep Skillz, and ice times in outside arenas in light of the fact that we will have a new ice surface? Yes, Jamie will keep all of these, as it is likely that we will need them again in a few years.**
 - l) **What is the date that the Dunbow arena will open? Oct 15/13 If it doesn't open on schedule, we will reduce practice times until the opening.**
 - m) **Will we be amending the bylaw concerning Executive Board members taking on coaching roles? Bylaws can only be amended at the AGM.**
