Who is Metro Sports International Inc?

Metro Sports International Inc was owned by Craig Thiessen of Edmonton who operated Grande Prairie Metro Ball Hockey and Edmonton Metro Ball Hockey. Only July 2, 2015 both EMBH and GPMBH Leagues were terminated from WRBHA Membership because Craig Thiessen refused to pay membership fees, forms and other bylaw infractions. On July 24, 2015 WRBHA received a bankruptcy notice for Metro Sports International Inc.

What does this mean to the sport of ball hockey?

Metro Sports International Inc bankruptcy means both EMBH and GPMBH no longer exist along with any other sports program or business of Metro Sports International Inc.

What does this mean for the teams/players?

New leagues will start under new operators in 2016. WRBHA has already been contacted by many interested individuals from the communities who want to start a league that will be members WRBHA.

I was affected financially by the bankruptcy of MSI, what do I do now because I did not receive a bankruptcy notice?

If you or someone you know was affected by the bankruptcy then do not delay in contacting the Bankruptcy Trustee who will provide you with Form 31 - Proof of Claim. Also if you know of any assets belonging to MSI let the Trustee know.
